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
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Acknowledgement of Territory

We are situated on land where the Bow River meets the Elbow River, and the traditional Blackfoot name of this place is "Mohkinstsis," which we now call the City of Calgary. The City of Calgary is also home to Métis Nation of Alberta, Region 3.

But that's just one reason why this partnership is important to RBC. "Bow Valley College is a great supporter of this community.


They make a real difference in the marketplace," says Jeff.

CELEBRATE INDIGENOUS LIFE AND LEARNING IN THE INIIKOKAAN CENTRE

Welcome to a centre committed to the success of Indigenous students. The Iniikokaan Centre is not only where Indigenous students at Bow Valley College come to find the services they need to succeed in school and life, it's a gathering place where you'll feel welcomed and Indigenous culture is celebrated.

COME HERE TO SUCCEED

The centre features a gathering space for our elders and students to conduct sharing circles, smudging, and cultural ceremonies. Culturally-relevant workshops, gatherings, and speaker series are delivered throughout the year in collaboration with community agencies. Support and advocacy are provided for Métis and First Nations; and band funding and presentations are offered regarding Indigenous student scholarships and bursaries.

CANADA DAY INDIGENOUS SHOWCASE AND TRADITIONAL POWWOW

Since 2013, Bow Valley College has presented the Canada Day Indigenous Showcase and Traditional Powwow in collaboration with the City of Calgary. This cultural celebration held on Prince's Island Park attracts more than 80,000 attendees annually, educating and engaging Albertans and visitors with Indigenous cultural activities.

By showcasing a wide range of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit ways of knowing and activities, we're demonstrating our commitment to Indigenous practices, community involvement, strengthening relationships, and to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action.



It's that place for spirituality, for cultural support, and it's that place where they can have one-on-ones with the elders as well. Because we want to support our students to be successful, but we also want them to have a place on campus that's relevant to them.

Now, Erwin is a career and employment advisor at Siksika Employment and Training Services. He's researching employment opportunities for people with disabilities and seeking the funding they need.



WHAT CAN THE STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION DO FOR YOU?



Services to help you thrive in school, work, and life

Learner Success Services provides resources to enhance the student experience and support academic success at Bow Valley College. Its four central spaces offer a range of services including student engagement, personal and academic support, and Indigenous cultural resources.

KEEP YOUR LEARNING ON TRACK

- **Academic Success Centre:** Connects students with peer tutors, learning coaches, writing support, and academic skills workshops.
- RGO Library and Learning Commons: Helps students explore library resources and access quiet and collaborative study spaces, computer lab, and bookable project rooms. Also offers academic success workshops.
- Iniikokaan Centre: Provides services to support and engage Indigenous students (the centre is also open to non-Indigenous students). Access the Cultural Resource Elders program, ceremonial smudge ceremonies and other teachings, educational sponsorship advocacy, computers, quiet study space, and large gathering room.
- Learner Success Services (LSS): Offers key services such as financial assistance, personal counselling, employment support, and accommodations for students with disabilities. The RISE (Reaching for Individual Success Everyday) program helps students create a tailored success plan.

LSS also supports volunteer opportunities, leadership development, and new student orientation, while its Co-Curricular Records provide transcripts of all learner activities and non-academic achievements.

Learner Success 101 is a free, online information resource available at your fingertips, 24/7. There's also a Multi-Faith Space and Fresh Routes Market.









Community connection and opportunity

Research and Innovation at Bow Valley College promotes stronger connections and partnerships with community organizations, industry, government, and other post-secondary institutions to create opportunities for students, employers, and our community.

LEARN FROM BUSINESS LEADERS

The College recently conducted three major studies funded by Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC) of Canada grants. These grants enabled us to work with community partners to make a difference through the development of social innovation initiatives:

- Social Innovation on the Ground: Accessible and Evidence-Based Tools for Social Innovators;
- Enhancing the Well-Being, Social, and Civic Engagement of Immigrant Women Retirees; and
- Bringing Hearts and Minds Together: Co-Creating Lifelong Learning Materials for Caregivers of Aboriginal Children.

Bow Valley College hosted its first Social Innovation Symposium in October 2018, to showcase innovation at Alberta colleges. We invited other institutions who received grants from the SSHRC Community and College Social Innovation Fund to a forum where we presented our work, and demonstrated the great value provided by the Alberta college sector through innovative applied research.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR RESEARCH AT BOW VALLEY COLLEGE?

Recognizing the strengths of our students, faculty, and employees, we will continue to explore opportunities with the Tri-Council research agencies for appropriate project funding. We will expand our agenda to make research part of the student and employer experience at Bow Valley College. Students will benefit from applied research projects by using their knowledge in the workplace environment to help organizations solve problems and identify efficiencies while strengthening their employment prospects.

After finishing up a print technology program at another post-secondary institution, the born-and-raised Calgarian enrolled in the Digital Design Diploma at Bow Valley College. Of the programs she had researched, she was confident the college's would be her best bet towards a career in graphic design. "The courses looked pretty great for what I wanted to learn," she says.

A panel of instructors and industry experts selected Michelle and three of her classmates for the showcase as part of the Intermediate Digital Design Tools course. Last summer, she and a peer represented Bow Valley College at the European Innovation Academy in Portugal, a leading tech entrepreneurship educator.

"I've had great experiences in terms of getting myself out there," says Michelle of the College. "I've never had that experience before with previous schooling."

4. GATHER YOUR TRANSCRIPTS

When applying to Bow Valley College through ApplyAlberta, applicants authorize Bow Valley College to obtain their Alberta high school and post-secondary transcripts. Applicants must arrange for their non-Alberta transcripts to be sent directly to Bow Valley College, from the issuing institution or school division. Transcripts should be submitted by mail to the Registrar's Office (see address under step #5). See the following page for information about submitting Proof of Enrolment for in-progress courses.

5. PAY THE NON-REFUNDABLE APPLICATION FEE

A non-refundable application fee of is required when you apply. Pay online using Visa or MasterCard or choose the "Pay Later" option. Your application information will be held until payment is made. Applicants can pay:

We strongly recommend applying 13 months in advance of the intended start of your studies. Students are admitted on a first-qualified, first-admitted basis, so applying early and submitting all relevant documents is essential.

SUBMITTING PROOF OF ENROLMENT

IF YOU'RE COMPLETING HIGH SCHOOL, UPGRADING, OR POST-SECONDARY STUDIES ELSEWHERE

If you are currently registered in courses that you need for admission to your program of interest, you will need to submit proof of enrolment.

Proof of enrolment must be issued by your school or school board and include:

- Your name
- Course names, course codes, and start and end dates of your courses
- Diploma exam date, if applicable
- Estimated date of graduation (for programs that require a high school diploma only)

The following types of documents may be submitted as proof of enrolment, provided that they include all of the details listed above:

- Course schedule
- Interim transcripts
- Letter from your school

If you are registered at Bow Valley College, email admissions@bowvalleycollege.ca with your Bow Valley College Student ID number and your program in the subject line so your application can be reassessed.

If you are scheduled to write an English proficiency test for admission to your program of interest, you will need to submit the following information:

- Your name
- Receipt and proof of test date for your English proficiency test (i.e: IELTS Academic, TOEFL)

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR PROOF OF ENROLMENT DOCUMENTS

- Submit a PDF copy of your proof of enrolment (photos and screenshots are not acceptable) by email to admissions@bowvalleycollege.ca.
- In the subject line of your email, include your Bow Valley College ID number and the name of the program you have applied for.

You may also drop off your documents in-person at the Office of the Registrar or any Bow Valley College regional campus.

AFTER YOU SUBMIT YOUR PROOF OF ENROLMENT

An Admissions Officer will review your proof of enrolment documents.

You may be granted Conditional Acceptance (or a Conditional Waitlist position) if your documents show that you will complete all of the admission requirements prior to the assigned deadline.

Students who are granted Conditional Acceptance will have their offer cancelled if they fail to achieve any of the required conditions (Example: minimum required grade in a course).

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Bow Valley College offers a number of entrance awards for students applying to Bow Valley College. These awards can range from one-time awards of \$1,000 to awards that are renewable to a maximum of \$10,000.

To apply for Bow Valley College Entrance Awards, you must first apply for admission, be accepted into a program, and pay the confirmation deposit.
