How is the International Student Welcome different from New Student Orientation?

International Student Welcome is part of the larger New Student Orientation initiative, that introduces students to academic departments and learner services. International Student Welcome will cover issues that are specific to international students, including study permits, post graduate work permits, academic breaks, working as an international student, and international learner advising.

It is important that you attend all other events during New Student Orientation, as they are available for both international students and domestic students. This ensures that you receive <u>all</u> necessary information for your student success, outside of immigration related issues.
