Read & Write and Remote Examinations

ISSUE: Not all accommodations work successfully with Respondus Lockdown Browser and Monitor

EXAMPLE ONE: Respondus Lockdown Browser and Monitor will NOT allow a student access to Read&Write (R&W). It locks the student out of the exam. Respondus Monitor requires Lockdown Browser.

EXAMPLE TWO: Students who require a reader or scribe (very few) are unable to utilize the common practice of having a live scribe or reader in a private room in LSS.

SOLUTION: Live remote invigilation/readers for students who require R&W by an approved Learner Success Services invigilator or academic school invigilator. Invigilator will use MS Teams to invigilate and student will share screen to allow invigilator to read the exam.

EQUIPMENT REQUIRED:

Computers/laptops with microphone and camera (both student and remote invigilator/reader).

PROCESS:

Before Test Day:

- 1. Student will go to the Accessibility Portal <u>https://accessibility.bowvalleycollege.ca</u> to book for the specific time their exam is scheduled
- 2. Instructor will receive an email notification about the exam. Instructors log in and confirm the exam details. They must also input the D2L exam password
- 3. Instructor will continue to receive the email notifications until they have provided the D2L exam password
- 4. Accessibility Services will arrange for an invigilator. The invigilator and student are connected to ensure that they have the technology requirements for the exam and will run through a quick mock test to help ensure success on the day of exam
- 5. Accessibility Services sets up a meeting in MS Teams and invites student

Day of Test- D2L test in Respondus:

- 1. Invigilator and student join the MS Teams meeting
- 2. Invigilator & student activate camera and microphone
- 3. Student logs on to D2L and shares their screen with invigilator
- 4. Invigilator tells the D2L test password to the student and the student types in the password to start the exam
- 5. Invigilator begins recording the test through MS Teams
- 6. Student begins the exam
- 7. Invigilator deactivates their camera to limit distraction (upon request/discussion)
- 8. Upon completion, invigilator stops the recording and notes any academic integrity concerns or technology issues.
