

Study Permit Guide January 2024



Do I have to start my program inside Canada (in person) in January 2024?

Bow Valley College requires all international students whose program starts in January 2024 to begin their studies <u>on</u> <u>campus</u> and only with proof of IRCC study approval.

Documents required to start classes in January 2024:

Students who wish to start their program must <u>first</u> receive and submit to Bow Valley College:

Letter of Introduction/ Port of Entry letter issued by IRCC	The document issued by a visa office which confirms approval of the study permit application. Students must present this document at the Port of Entry when arriving in Canada.				
<u>A valid Study</u> <u>Permit</u>	The document issued at the Port of Entry in Canada which authorizes a foreign national to study at an educational institution.				
<u>A valid Work</u> <u>Permit</u>	Please contact us through your VAS account if you have a valid work permit (not co-op work permit).				
To <u>enter Canada</u> prior to starting classes you will require:					
<u>Study Visa or</u> <u>eTA</u>	In addition to the Letter Of Introduction/Port of Entry letter issued by the visa office, international students also require a Temporary Resident Visa for students, or an electronic Travel Authorization (eTA). The visa office determines which of these you receive.

What should I do if IRCC refuses my study permit application?

Submit a copy of IRCC's refusal letter no later than the Study Permit Deadline, November 26, 2023, to qualify for a refund of the confirmation deposit and any additional tuition fees paid. Deferring your program start date is not an option if your study permit application is refused.

*To qualify for a tuition refund students **must** first drop all registered courses in their MyBVC student portal. This includes students of ELL, Health Care Aide, and all Centre for Entertainment Arts programs; although course registration is automatic, students in these programs are personally responsible for emailing <u>registrar@bowvalleycollege.ca</u> to request their courses be dropped to qualify for a refund.

CLICK HERE to log into the VAS portal and confirm your attendance for January 2024

After you sign into your account in VAS:

<u>Leave a message</u> on your application informing us of your attendance decision and upload the <u>required</u> supporting documents in VAS <u>NO LATER THAN November 26, 2023</u>.

- Message: "I received my IRCC <u>study approval</u> and will start classes in January 2024"
 - → Upload a copy of IRCC's letter of introduction/student visa/study permit (& co-op work permit, if applicable) or work permit by November 26, 2023.
- Message: "I received an IRCC study <u>refusal</u> letter"
 - → Upload a copy of IRCC's refusal letter by November 26, 2023.
 - → You can then request a refund for your confirmation fee and any additional tuition fee paid.

3 Provide your decision for your January 2024) Application

- Message: "I have a valid IRCC <u>work permit</u> and will start classes in January 2024"
 - → You MUST contact us through your VAS account by November 26, 2023, since we need to review your work permit and advise.

NOTE: Please note that Work Permit is different than Co-op Work Permit. If you have a Co-op Work Permit, then this DOES NOT APPLY TO YOU.

- Message: "I want to request a deferral" (approval not guaranteed; and previously deferred applications cannot be deferred a second time)
 - → Upload a copy of the study permit application submission confirmation letter from IRCC (showing the date you submitted the application to IRCC) by November 26, 2023. Deferral requests received after the deadline will be denied.

• "But, what if I am still waiting for IRCC's decision on my study permit application?"

→ Message us in VAS now if you have questions about your situation – do not wait until close to the deadline to get advice. You also need to upload a copy of the study permit application submission confirmation letter from IRCC (showing the date you submitted the application to IRCC) by November 26, 2023.



IMPORTANT – All international students **must have** IRCC approval documents and **must register for in-class courses** for the January 2024 intake to be eligible for postgraduation work permit. For assistance with course registration, please contact <u>Academic Advising</u>.

DEFERRALS REQUESTS <u>ONLY</u> FOR STUDENTS WITH DUOLINGO SCORE UNDER 110

Starting May 2024, the minimum required Duolingo score for admission has increased from 95 to 110.

If you are **NOT** requesting a deferral and wish to remain confirmed to January 2024, **you do not need to submit a new Duolingo score.**

If you are requesting a deferral from January 2024 to a later intake, you must retake your Duolingo test and score a **minimum of 110 overall** before we can review your deferral request and upload the new Duolingo result in VAS no later than the Study Permit Deadline, **November 26, 2023**, to have your deferral request reviewed

If you are unable to meet this updated minimum Duolingo requirement, please message us in VAS for advising.

REGISTER EARLY IN FIRST-TERM COURSES FOR BEST SELECTION. NEW STUDENTS CAN BEGIN REGISTERING FOR COURSES <u>OCTOBER 23-26, 2023</u>, DEPENDING ON THE PROGRAM

January 2024: Course Registration & Delivery Mode

International students **must** register for **in-class courses** when available and must take a majority of courses inclass throughout their program to satisfy study permit and post-graduation work permit (PGWP) requirements.

Registration in a **minimum of 3 courses/9 course credits per term** is required to maintain full-time student status and is required of all international students.

All international students require a **Co-op Work Permit** along with a **Study Permit,** except Health and Human Services, Business Administration (certificate + diploma), Human Resources and CEA programs. For more information, please visit our webpage: <u>Co-op Work</u> <u>Permits</u>.
